 - ✓ Betrayal by one.
 - ✓ Deserted by the others.
- ✓ The responses of those in his “trial” process.
- ✓ **YET**, he showed the full extent of his love.

- Chapters 13 -17 tell us the things Jesus said to His disciples on the night before his death.
- The words were all spoken in one evening to the disciples only.
- He gave final instructions to prepare them for his death and resurrection.
- He advised how these events would change their lives forever.

- Jesus was the model servant.
- He showed his servant attitude by doing things normally done by servants of that day, such as the washing of guest feet.
- He teaches through his actions.
- Are you willing to follow his example of serving?



- Can you serve those who are beneath you?
- The role of the devil – already *enticed* Judas to betray Jesus.

- ✓ **The Authority of God** was given to Jesus over everything.
- ✓ Jesus knew He had come from his father and would return to his father.

- ✓ He got up from the table, took off his robe, wrapped a towel around his waist and poured water into a basin.
- ✓ Then, he begin washing the disciples feet and wipe them with the towel he had around him.

- When Jesus got to Simon Peter, Peter asked, “Are you going to wash my feet”?
- Jesus responded, “You don’t understand” what I am doing but someday you will.
- Peter said, “You will never ever wash my feet”.
- Jesus said, “Unless I wash you, you won’t belong to me”.
- Then Peter said, “Wash my hands and head as well”, not just my feet!
- Jesus responds, a person has bathed all over does not need to wash except for his feet to be entirely clean. And you disciples are clean, but not all of you. V-11.
- He knew the unclean disciple who would betray him.

- **V-12-17 – After washing their feet, he put on his robe again and sat down asking if they understood what he was doing.**
- **You call me “Teacher” and “Lord” and you are right – it is true.**
- **And since I have washed your feet you ought to wash each other’s feet.**
- **I have given you an example to follow. Do as I have done to you.**
- **A servant is not greater than the master, nor messengers more important than the one who sends them.**
- **You know these things, now do them.**


- **I am not saying these things to all of you; I know the ones I have chosen.**
- **This fulfills scripture that says the one who eats my food has turned against me.**
- **I tell you this so when it happens you will believe I am the Messiah.**
- **I tell you the truth; anyone who welcomes my messenger is welcoming me.**
- **Anyone who is welcoming me is welcoming the Father who sent me.**

Jesus And The Disciples Share The Last Supper – V 21-30

- Jesus was deeply troubled – one of you will **betray** me!
- They looked around at each other wondering who it was.
- The disciple whom Jesus loved was sitting next to Jesus and Peter was sitting next to him. They talk amongst themselves.
- John then asked Jesus who is it?
- It is the one to whom I will give the bread I dip in the bowl.
- He dipped the bread and gave it to Judas.

Share The Last Supper



- When Judas took the bread Satan entered into him.
- Jesus tells him to hurry and do what he is going to do.
- The other disciples did not know what Jesus meant.
- Judas was their treasurer so some thought Jesus was telling him to go and pay for something or give money to someone and he leaves.

Jesus Predicts Peter's Denial – V 31-38

- As soon as Judas left Jesus said, “The time has come for the Son of Man to enter into his glory and God will be glorified because of him.”
- God receives glory because of the Son, he will give his own glory to the son, and will do so at once.
- I will be with you for a little longer. You will search for me but cannot come where I am going.
- I give you a new commandment: Love each other, just as I have loved you; you should love each other.
- Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.

Jesus Predicts Peter's Denial – V 31-38

- Peter asked where he was going.
- Jesus responds that Peter could not go with him but would follow him later.
- Peter ask why he couldn't go now; says he is ready to die.
- Jesus says, “**Die for me**, I tell you the truth, Peter - before the rooster crows tomorrow morning, you will deny three times that you even know me.”
- He knows all about us.....
